## 1. Gardasil<sup>®</sup> (HPV) catch-up programme:

- from 01 Sept 2008 for girls born in 1990 & 1991.
- phased from 2009 & 2010 for girls born after 01 Jan 1990 & aged 12-18 years.
- For details of the programme see MoH website or information from your DHB.

2. **Prevenar<sup>®</sup>** (PCV7) is free for infants born from 01 January 2008. 3. **Prevenar<sup>®</sup>** (PCV7) fourth dose, given at 15 months of age, starts April 2009 for infants born from 01 Jan 2008. 4. **ADT<sup>®</sup>-Booster** vaccine is free for 45 & 65 year olds. There is no immunisation claim payable to the administrator. 5. **Influenza vaccination** for adults and children from 6 months old with certain chronic medical conditions – see Immunisation Handbook (Ministry of Health).

## Additional vaccines for special groups

**Birth: BCG vaccine** for babies at high risk from tuberculosis (TB) – see Immunisation Handbook (Ministry of Health).

**Hepatitis B vaccine** plus hepatitis B immunoglobulin for infants of hepatitis B carrier mothers.

### Children < 5 years at high risk of invasive pneumococcal disease:

Pneumococcal vaccination (conjugate or polysaccharide) - see 2008 National Immunisation Schedule Health Provider Booklet (Ministry of Health).

### Children and adults with splenectomy and/or functional asplenia:

Pneumococcal, Hib, MeNZB<sup>™</sup> and Meningococcal A, C, Y, W-135 vaccines - see 2008 National Immunisation Schedule Health Providers Booklet (Ministry of Health).

### Hepatitis B carriers:

Immunisation for household and sexual contacts.

### Women:

MMR vaccine for women of childbearing age who are susceptible to rubella.
