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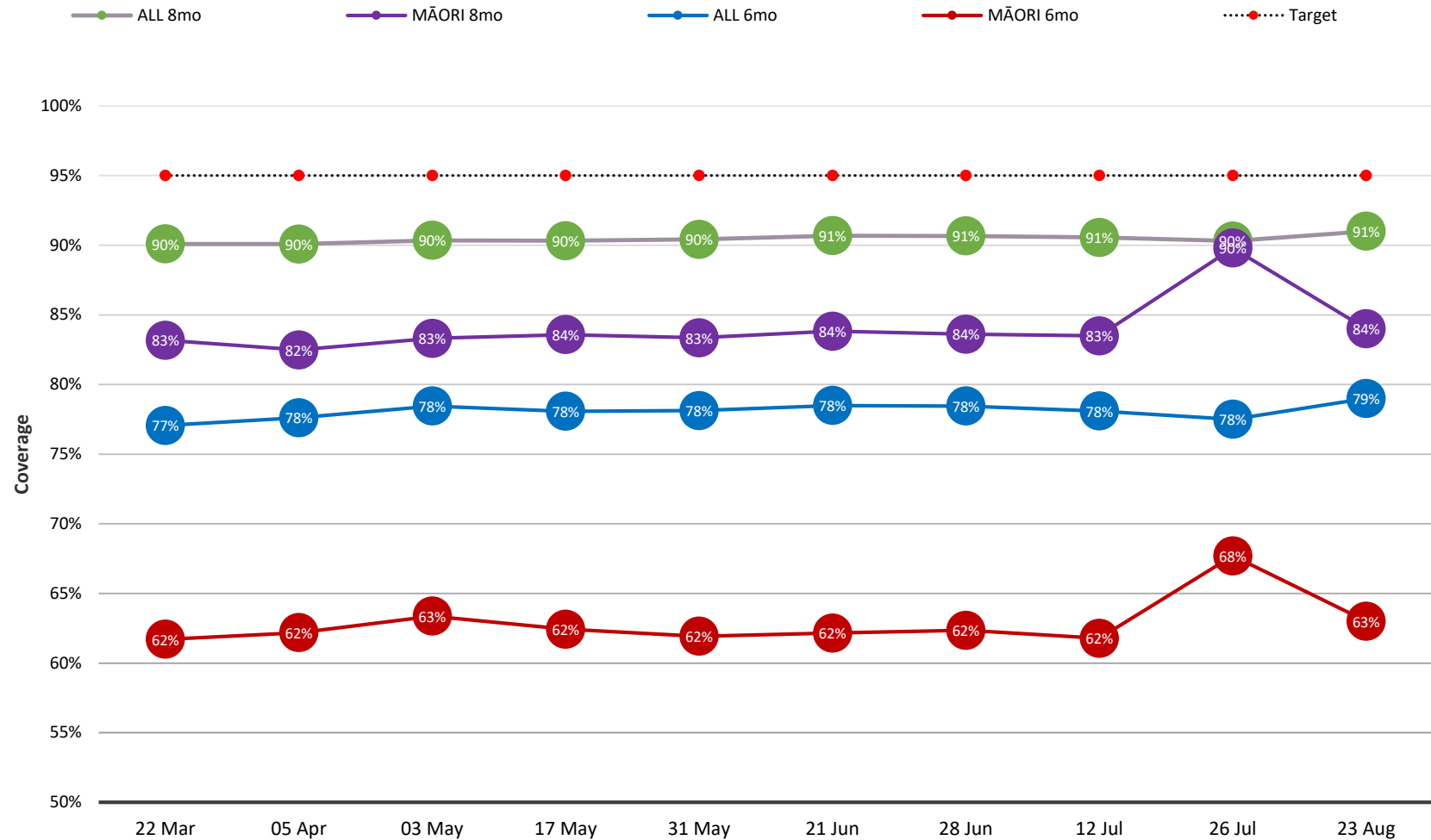
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# Immunisation coverage for tamariki Māori



# Complex lives

- Increasing income inequity in Aotearoa New Zealand
  - Greater impact on Māori whānau
  - Increased stress for working parents who may need multiple jobs to support their whānau
- Uncertainty around housing
  - Impossible cost of buying a home for Māori whānau
  - Increasing rents and limited housing availability
  - Unhealthy homes and overcrowding
- Consequences of income and housing inequities
  - Māori parents are living with high levels of stress
  - Increased mobility within a DHB
  - Increased mobility across DHBs

# Accessible and appropriate services

- Pathways to immunisation
  - Are whānau able to access primary health care?
  - How can tamariki Māori be immunised if they are not accessing primary health care?
  - What innovative solutions might improve access for Māori whānau?
- Ensuring health services are responsive to Māori
  - How do we communicate with whānau?
  - How can we develop trust in our relationships with whānau?
