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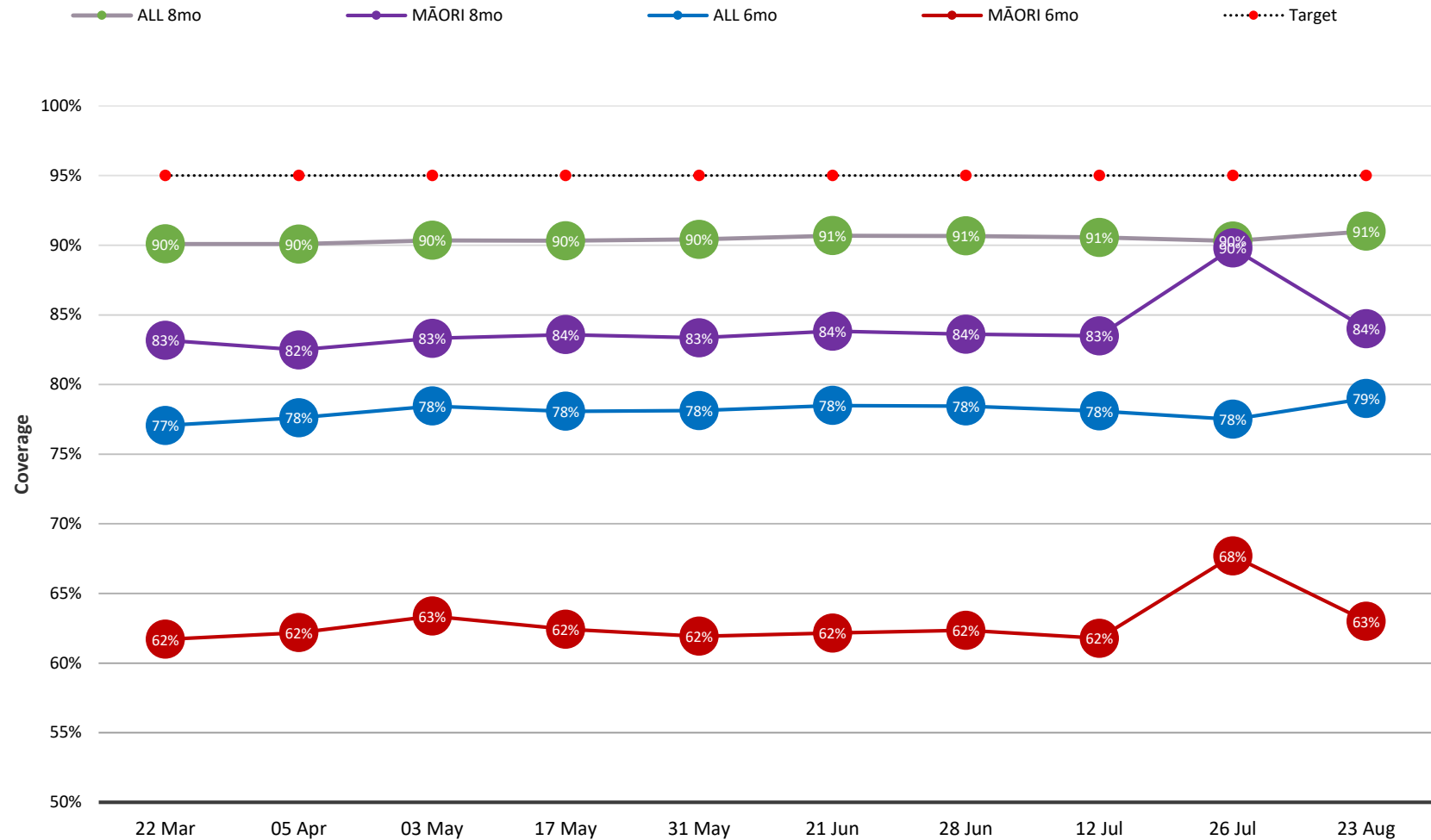

# Challenges for timeliness and coverage

- Poor timeliness for primary course of immunisations at 6 months of age
- Poor levels of coverage for primary course of immunisations at 8 months of age
- Persistent inequities between tamariki Māori and non-Māori children
  
- We know that Māori whānau want good health outcomes for their tamariki
- How do we improve access and timeliness to immunisation services?
- How do we achieve and maintain high rates fo immunisation coverage?

# Improving coverage and timeliness

- Clear accountability for improving timeliness and coverage rates for tamariki Māori across each level of the health system
- Support and resources to develop local solutions that work for Māori whānau
- Research to address barriers that Māori whānau face in access to and appropriateness of immunisation services within the context of primary health care
- Policy to improve the social determinants of health for Māori whānau
